At-risk children who don't receive high-quality early childhood education are:

25%

More likely to drop out of school

40%

More likely to become a teen parent

50%

More likely to be placed in Special Education

60%

More likely to never attend college

70%

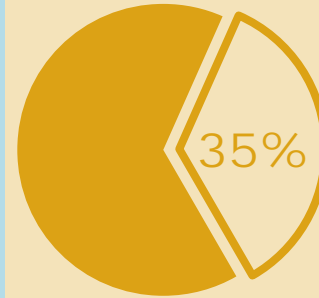
Families need us
